Dear Friends and Prayer Partners,

I noticed in Luke 1 that Zachariah was troubled and gripped with fear at the angel's greeting; whereas Mary was troubled, but curious about the angel's greeting. Maybe Zachariah's reaction was because he had a rope tied to his ankle, in case he dropped dead in the Holy Place. Mary, on the other hand, was in the safety and security of her own home. Still both announcements were humanly impossible – a virgin and an old woman. The angel assures Mary that "with God nothing will be impossible" (Luke 1:37).

Sometimes we receive news that troubles us and grips us with fear (like a cancer diagnosis). Other times we are troubled, but we are expectant. **WMP** has prayed for a troubling impossible situation for about 15 months. We praise God because, in answer to prayer, a container of scripture has legally entered a restricted country. Praise the God of impossiblities.

Only once are we told that we can do something impossible. "I say to you, if you have faith as a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you" (Matthew 17:20).

Faith also involves other "impossibilities": Without faith it is impossible to please Him [God] (Hebrews 11:6); and it is impossible for those who were once enlightened, ... if they fall away, to renew them again to repentance (Hebrews 6:4-6).

It is interesting that our relationship with God often involves the impossible. The Gospel story itself, our redemption, and our glorification are possible because nothing is impossible with God. Whether we go gripped with fear, or curiously expectant, this truth holds when we enter the prayer closet — the place of impossible possibilities.
